The most successful coach coordinator in the history of RNSWBA lawn bowls:
 "Terry could convince an ordinary club bowler he was a champion and they would go out on the green and play like the Jack Gibson of lawn bowls."

- Terry Harmer began his career at Alexandria-Erskineville BC in the early 1970s.
- In his first year he won the Minor Singles, the Metropolitan Reserve Singles and the Grade 6 Metropolitan Pennant.
- On 25 November 1980 he became NSW Cap #775 and went on to represent on 41 occasions.
- Moving to St George, Terry was successful in almost every club and Zone event and skipped his Zone rink to success in the inaugural State U-45s Zone Championship.
- From a rough, tough former rugby league hitman, Terry "Moose" Harmer hit the Hunter District's Maitland City Club by storm in late 1986 as basically the first of the full-time bowls coach/coordinators. His 'no frills, no nonsense' approach soon bore fruit at a club which had not won a pennant since the late 1940s.

- Posthumously, Terry Harmer has been rewarded with a green and a Major Pairs Tournament named after him at Maitland City BC – the club he 'put on the map'.
